Advocacy/Outreach

Some highlights to our 2019 Advocacy & Outreach efforts include:

- Met with Aiken Board of Realty members three times. Conducted a one-day educational program for local realtors.
- Met with state and national representatives and their staffs.
- Wrote opinion pieces about the importance of the Advanced Manufacturing Collaborative project, the potential for Plutonium Pit Production at SRS etc. In total we published 6 editorial pieces and 17 news releases.
- Interviewed by local news outlets as the unbiased expert several times.
- Launched the new CNTA website. Mobile and Tablet friendly, this portal describing all CNTA does was brought into the smartphone era.
- In June, a public meeting was held to start the EIS process on potential plutonium pit production at SRS. At this meeting community leaders, supporters & opponents spoke. One conservative count put the number of CNTA members in the room at 35!
- Reached over 30,000 households with the Nuclear Science Week Insert in the Aiken Standard.

28th Annual Teller Lecture & Banquet

The 28th Annual Edward Teller lecture was held on October 16 at the USC Aiken Convocation Center. Over 200 people joined CNTA in recognizing this year's award and scholarship winners and got to hear a fantastic talk about "Nuclear Energy in Crisis" by this year's Teller Lecturer, Michael Shellenberger.

Shellenberger is the founder and president of Environmental Progress. He is a leading pro-nuclear environmentalist and expert on energy, security, and environmental issues. He is a regular contributor to *Forbes*, *The New York Times*, *The Wall Street Journal*, and *The Washington Post*. His TED talks on nuclear energy topics have been viewed over three million times.

Several award and scholarship winners were recognized at the banquet. These include the Fred C. 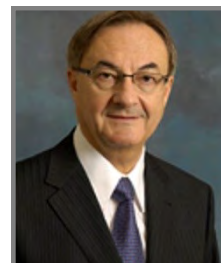

Distinguished Scientist Award

Citizens for Nuclear Technology Awareness (CNTA) is pleased to announce that the winner of the 2019 Fred C. Davidson Distinguished Scientist Award is Dr. Dan Gabriel Cacuci.

Dr. Cacuci is the SmartState Endowed Chair Professor of Mechanical Engineering and the Director of the SmartState Center of Excellence in Nuclear Science and Energy at the University of South Carolina. He received his M.S. in Nuclear Engineering at Columbia University in 1973, his M.Phil. in Applied Physics and Nuclear Engineering at Columbia University in 1977, and his Ph.D. in Applied Physics, Mechanical and Nuclear Engineering from Columbia University in 1978. Dr. Caruci's areas of scientific expertise include the analysis of large-scale physical/engineering systems; large-scale scientific computations; nuclear reactor physics, dynamics, and safety; and sensitivity analysis, data assimilation, and predictive uncertainty quantification for large-scale systems.



The Distinguished Scientist Award is presented annually to recognize regional scientists and engineers who have made exceptional lifetime scientific achievements. The award is in honor of Dr. Fred C. Davison who was Chairman of CNTA's Board of Directors from 1994 until his death in 2004.

Nuclear Service Award

The Citizens for Nuclear Technology Awareness (CNTA) recently awarded the first-ever Nuclear Service Award to J. Scott Kirk for his significant lifetime achievements in the advancement of nuclear technology.

Kirk's work has spanned from licensing nuclear facilities that provide nuclear fuel for the United States Navy, to supporting nuclear non-proliferation programs established by the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), to being a recognized expert in his roles at providing solutions to many of the complex waste management problems that have faced the nuclear industry. Among many other notable achievements, Kirk has been a leader in the DOE's recent reinterpretation of the definition of HLW by providing regulatory/technical guidance to the DOE to conduct a pilot program to classify certain waste from DWPF as non-HLW for dispositioning as low-level waste at a commercial disposal facility.



The purpose of CNTA's Nuclear Service Award is to recognize accomplishments in applying nuclear technology, advancing education in nuclear technology, increasing public awareness of the benefits of nuclear technology and in promoting and defending the safe and effective use of nuclear technology.

Activities of the Education Committee Volunteers

Our Education Committee constantly evaluates our educational programs and deliberates on changes to existing programs or new initiatives. While very successful, the Southeastern Summer Nuclear Institute (SSNI) had seen declining participation in recent years. It was decided to not conduct the SSNI session in 2019; however, we may offer the program in future years.

With this decision, we reached out to Aiken County Public school administrators to identify areas where teacher support is lacking.

In 2019, we launched the **CNTA High School Educator Grants Program**. Grants in an amount of \$500 were awarded for winning applications. The grants could be used to fund a project in any area of science or technology that promotes an increased understanding of atomic and nuclear fundamentals, radiation and nuclear materials safety, and applications of nuclear technology.

The Education Committee will continue to evaluate CNTA's educational programs and welcomes input and suggestions from the membership. Or better yet, if you have interest, please join our committee!

Some of our 2019 Accomplishments:

- Conducted Nuclear Blitz reaching over 1000 students across **49 classrooms**.
- Participated in more than **10 STEM** outreach events in South Carolina and Georgia
- Awarded **more than \$13,000** in Scholarships & Grants
- Hosted **2 Japanese delegations** associated with Fukushima-Daiichi cleanup
- Taught a summer class for DOE sponsored program for students from Minority Serving Institutions
- Provided instruction on nuclear technologies to **8 middle schools** participating in Future City competition
- Organized a Lifelong Learning class at USCA dedicated to the role of SRNL. "SRNL: Protecting our Nation and our World" was well received by the over 30 attendees at each class.

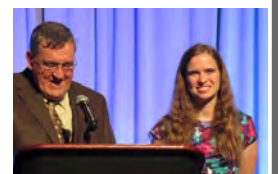

Aiken Technical College Scholarship-The 2019 recipient of the ATC CNTA Scholarship is Ms. Jessica Busch. Jessica is enrolled in the Radiation Protection Program and is a resident of North Augusta, South Carolina. She will be graduating in May with her Associate of Science Degree, Major in Radiation Protection.

This annual scholarship is awarded to a second year student in ATC's Radiation Protection Technology Program. To be considered, a student must be nominated by a faculty member.

Robert Maher Memorial Scholarship- The \$5000 scholarship is awarded annually to a student who has demonstrated outstanding college-level academic achievement in nuclear science/engineering or related fields. The 2019 winner was South Carolina State University senior Amelia Manhardt, who is a nuclear engineering student. The 2019 contest also saw a Special Merit Award of \$1,000 given to Kennesaw State University junior Alisa Machiwalla. These awards were generously sponsored by AECOM and Savannah River Remediation.



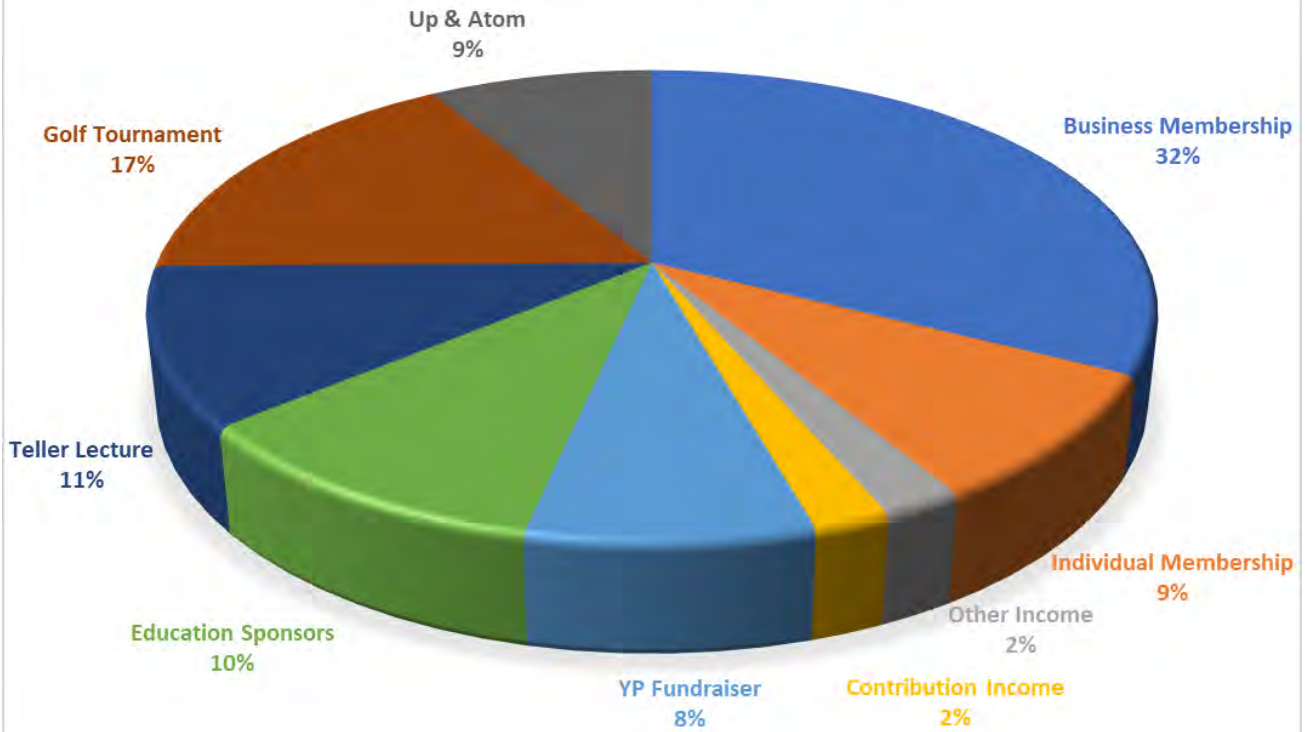

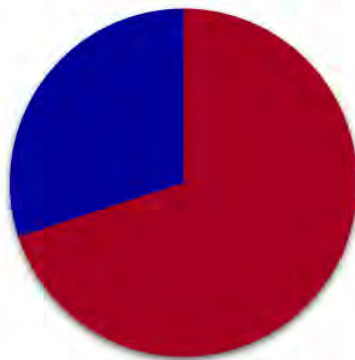


CNTA Finances at a Glance
