Activities of the Education Committee Volunteers

SSNI & Nuclear Blitz

Citizens for Nuclear Technology Awareness presented its annual Southeastern Summer Nuclear Institute at University of South Carolina Aiken's Ruth Patrick Science Education Center. For the last four years, CNTA has presented SSNI for area educators, including teachers, guidance counselors, and career advisors, sharing insights about the nuclear technology field and how to incorporate STEM concepts into K-12 curricula.



Participants this year came from all over the region and from all levels of education. Elementary, middle and high school educators, administrators, and representatives from adult continuing-education programs attended SSNI.

Workshop discussions included a variety of industry-related topics, including atomic and nuclear fundamentals, power generation, nuclear applications and career opportunities. In addition to workshops and discussions led by leading scientists and educators, participants visited area nuclear and education facilities including the Savannah River Site, Plant Vogtle and Aiken Technical College.

"I have taught physics for 10 years, and this workshop allowed me to delve into nuclear topics more deeply and to interact with veterans from the nuclear industry," said Robert Bennett, a teacher at Douglas County High School. "This has provided me resources that I can directly use in the classroom."

Samaritan Simmons, an accelerated 7th grade math teacher at Lakeside Middle School also spoke favorably about the workshop. "I was looking to learn more information on nuclear [technology] to clarify any misconceptions that I might have had. I learned lots of information in the presentations and tours that clarified misinformation that I had received. Teachers can't teach unless they understand the information and materials they are teaching. This workshop enhanced my understanding on a number of nuclearrelated topics."

CNTA also conducted a "Nuclear Blitz" throughout Aiken County High School chemistry classes again in 2018. This year handson demonstration on measurement and management of radiation and an illustration of dose rates we experience in our everyday lives accompanied the lecture material. Visits were made to 63 classes in 7 schools reaching over 1200 students! Thanks to the more than 25 CNTA members and friends who supported the teach-ins.

CNTA Scholarships & Awards

Essay Contest – Three area high school seniors each earned a \$1,000 cash prize in the 2018 CNTA High School Essay Contest. In addition each school received \$500. "The goal of the CNTA Essay Contest is to increase high school student awareness of nuclear technologies and their impact on society," (Dr. Marissa Reigel).


The winners were: Ankita Shah (Evans High School), Caleb Kerr (South Aiken High School) and Alex Bates (Lakeside High School).

<u>Video Contest-</u> A team from Stallings Island Middle School won the video contest for their entry "The Wrong Perspective: Nuclear Energy." For the winning entry, the school was awarded a GoPro camera with all the accessories at their school awards ceremony. All participating students were given a CNTA tee-shirt.

<u>Aiken Technical College Scholarship-</u> To commemorate the organization's 25th anniversary, CNTA established a scholarship at ATC for a deserving student enrolled in one of the nuclear programs. This scholarship is awarded to a student pursuing a career in a nuclear technology field. The winner in 2018 was Christopher Bruce of Johnston SC. He was a student in the Radiation Protection Technology Program and graduated in Spring 2018.

<u>Robert Maher Memorial Scholarship</u>. The \$5000 scholarship is awarded annually to a student who has demonstrated outstanding college-level academic achievement in nuclear science/ engineering or related fields. The 2018 winner was University of South Carolina student Lucas Dull. Lucas is a mechanical engineering major with a minor in nuclear engineering. He interned at SRS in the summer of 2018.

<u>Fred C. Davidson Distinguished Scientist Award-</u> Dr. Brian A. Powell was recognized as CNTA's 2018 Distinguished Scientist. Dr. Powell is the Fjeld Professor of Environmental Engineering and Earth Sciences at Clemson University. He was also named to a joint position with SRNL to advance research on environmental remediation and radioactive waste disposal.

CNTA Keystone Event: Teller Lecture & Banquet

CNTA hosted its 27th Annual Teller Lecture & Awards Banquet on October 18, 2018. The Teller Award winner was Dr. Jose N. Reyes, Jr. Dr. Reyes is the co-founder and Chief Technology Officer of NuScale Power. He is the co-inventor of the NuScale small modular reactor (SMR) with over 110 patents granted or pending in 20 countries. He is an expert on nuclear plant scaling, passive safety, and testing. He is Professor Emeritus and former head of the Department of Nuclear Engineering at Oregon State University (OSU). He was the OSU principal investigator for the Westinghouse AP600 and AP1000 design certification test programs. He is also an ANS Fellow and Member of the National Academy of Engineering.

Dr. Reyes provided an enlightening lecture on the status of NuScale's SMR development efforts. He also energized the crowd on the promise that the SMR technology can offer to the world's energy needs and the myriad opportunities to apply SMRs to industrial applications.

Dr. Edward Teller presented a public lecture in Augusta, GA in 1992 and allowed CNTA to name its annual lecture and banquet in his honor. The Annual Teller Lecture and Banquet is CNTA's largest community outreach activity. The audience primarily consists of community leaders, elected officials, and nuclear professionals. Some high school and college students also attend courtesy of corporate and college donors.


