Apprenticeships Celebrated at Up & Atom Breakfast

Attendees at the November 20, 2024, Up & Atom Breakfast celebrated National Apprenticeship Week. The breakfast, hosted by Citizens for Nuclear Technology Awareness (CNTA), focused on the Workforce Opportunities in Regional Careers (WORC) grant funds and the many partner organizations that help our region's employee pipeline.

Guests learned about how regional educational institutions are investing in our future workforce and educating students on potential career pathways.

"These programs allow local citizens across the South Carolina and Georgia region to have multiple pathways to develop critical skills needed in today's workforce." Mets said during her presentation.

More than 1,877 students have enrolled in training programs relevant to local careers using WORC grant funding.

The WORC grant is funded by the Department of Energy and the National Nuclear Security Administration. The grant is overseen by the SRS Community Reuse Organization (SRSCRO).

Representatives from educational institutions, Savannah River Site employers, and supporters of the apprenticeship programs were all recognized during the event.

"The growth of the apprenticeship programs in the region is a testament to visionaries who understand our future workforce needs. Without our community partners jobs would be going unfilled and interested people would not have the ability to learn the skills needed to fill these positions." Booboo Roberts said.
