Dr. Jeffrey (Jeff) C. Griffin is the President and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of SRNS, responsible to the Department of Energy (DOE) for safe, effective and efficient management and operations of the Savannah River Site (SRS). SRS is one of DOE's largest production sites, performing activities ranging from environmental cleanup and protection, to nuclear materials storage and disposition, including operation of the only U.S. tritium plant and design and construction of the Savannah River Plutonium Processing Facility. His responsibilities include providing vision, leadership, mission growth, technological advancement, and a performance-based culture of safety, security and operational excellence at the Site.

Jeff has more than 30 years in leading multimillion-dollar research and development programs, nuclear operations support, and technology development initiatives in a highly regulated environment.

He holds a BS in Chemistry from Georgia Southern University and a PhD in Nuclear Chemistry from Georgia Institute of Technology.
